# GAME DAY



No Game Day Parking: Public transportation and care service should be used for parking at Petco Park. There are no media specific. The MTS trolley system can drop you off at Petco Park for easy access. Trolley tickets available at <u>www.Pronto.com</u>.

**Food and Beverage Service**: Credentialed media in the press box will be supplied a pre-game meal starting at 3:00 p.m. Hot and cold beverages will be available pregame through postgame with a halftime snack.

**Statistical Information**: Game statistics will be provided in the press box via StatBroadcast. Final media play-by-play will be available following the game.

**Photo Room**: Still photographers have access to a highspeed wireless work area in the Petco Park press box and there will be tables adjacent to the Padres locker room.

**Trophy Presentation**: After the game, the winning team will remain on the field for the presentation of the most valuable offensive and defensive player trophies, and for the presentation of the Holiday Bowl championship trophy. The presentations will be staged along the press box sideline.

**Postgame Interviews**: The postgame interview room is located adjacent to the press box elevator in the auxiliary locker room. Following a 10-minute cooling off period, the losing coach and selected players will be escorted to the interview room in Aux 1 and begin their press conference. The head coach will make opening statements, followed by a question-and-answer period. Take the press elevator to the street level. The winning head coach and selected players will follow. The format for this press conference is identical to that of the losing team.

**Postgame Quotes**: Players and coaches quotes will be made available to the media after the game.
