GAME DAY

Game Day Parking: Public transportation and care service should be used for parking at Snapdragon Stadium. The MTS trolley system can drop you off at Snapdragon Stadium for easy access. Trolley tickets available at www.Pronto.com.

Food and Beverage Service: Credentialed media in the press box will have a pre-game meal starting at 3:30 p.m. Hot and cold beverages will be available pregame through postgame.

Statistical Information: Game statistics will be provided in the press box via StatBroadcast. Final media play-by-play will be available following the game.

Photo Workroom: Take Main Elevator to Level 1: Off elevator go right to the Loading Dock area by South End of field next to Main Tunnel in Room #1901. There will be food in that room at 3:30 p.m.

Trophy Presentation: After the game, the winning team will remain on the field for the presentation of the most valuable offensive and defensive player trophies, and for the presentation of the Trust & Will Holiday Bowl championship trophy. The presentations will be staged along the press box sideline.

Postgame Interviews: Following a 10-minute cooling off period, the losing coach and selected players will be escorted to the interview room in Cox Business area and begin their press conference. The head coach will make opening statements, followed by a question-and-answer period. Take elevator Level 4 to Level 1. Go inside Cox Business Center. The interview room is in room 1027. The winning head coach and selected players will follow. The format for this press conference is identical to that of the losing team.

Postgame Quotes: Players and coaches quotes will be made available to the media after the game.
